





UDINE – Apart from the pronunciation and a single vowel, English adjective "diverse" and Italian adjective "diverso" are identical twins: they indicate asymmetry and they indicate multiplicity. In other words, they contain the two words that best describe the **Far East Film Festival and its long international history**. A history which is certainly diverso, in fact, and which began to explore cinematic Asia when cinematic Asia was still an unknown quantity in Europe. It now has **24 editions under its belt and another one - the 25**th – **all set for take off: the most "diverse" FEFF ever!**

How many precious **cultural asymmetries** will be shown? How many priceless **artistic multiplicities** will be witnessed? From **the 21**st **to the 29**th **of April**, at the **"Giovanni da Udine" Teatro Nuovo** theatre and at the **Visionario** cinema, **FEFF 25** will travel into the future as a narrator of the Far East of yesterday and of today - of the colours of the past, through the anarchic, free-spirited gaze of packed retrospective **A/B side VIBES** - **Greatest Hits from the '80s & '90s**, and of the colours of the present, through the **42 films in competition** (a total of **78 titles from 14 countries with 9 world premieres, 13 international premieres, 14 European**

Asymmetry and multiplicity, we were saying. So here's contemporary Asia investigated through **current affairs journalism** (**Giulia Pompili and Francesco Radicioni** return to Udine with the international morning press review, the 4 episodes of brand new podcast **Bambù** and a series of talks), **youthful cultural**

premieres and 23 Italian premieres) and a host of other themed selections.

journalism (like that of the students of the **FEFF Campus**), **visual art** (the partnership with cartoonist **Vincenzo Filosa** is back), the **"Industry" connections between East and West** (under the banner of **Focus Asia**) and, of course, the unmissable **Far East Film Events** which will fill the centre of Udine (one event above all: the now legendary **Far East Cosplay Contest**, scheduled for **Monday the 24**th **of April**).

OPENING/CLOSING

The festival will be opening with the **first co-production between Singapore and South Korea**: He Shuming's **Ajoomma**, the story of a middle-aged Singaporean lady who dreams of visiting the homeland of her beloved K-Dramas. It's a journey full of twists and turns and unexpected events and, given the obvious cultural and linguistic barriers between the two countries, also of misunderstandings... Bursting with humour and sentiment, it's a feel-good movie that just might become a little international hit! The second title of the **Opening Night** - the uncompromising **Bad Education** – is a completely different kettle of fish: a pitch black, cruelly hilarious comedy written and produced by Giddens, enfant terrible of Taiwanese cinema! 77 minutes that hit hard and whose first-time director is an old acquaintance of the **FEFF**: Kai Ko, the protagonist of **You Are The Apple of My Eyes**. The **Closing Night** will instead play host to **Zhang Yimou**'s latest masterpiece: a deeply sophisticated period film which mixes mystery, humour and action. Inspired by the famous poetic patriotic text from which it takes its title, **Full River Red** is set in 1146 in the Chinese Song dynasty. Rapid-fire dialogue and a techno-rock soundtrack counterpoint sequences shot in the narrow streets of ancient villages... You shouldn't be surprised: **we're talking about Zhang Yimou**, after all!

LINE-UP

If, and it bears repeating, the line-up includes 78 films (a FEFF record!) from 14 countries (including Mongolia, present for the second time in the history of the Festival), it also certainly bears underlining that it includes 15 female directors and 12 newcomers. The 2023 selection aims to showcase the immense complexity of Asia more than ever before. A selection that seamlessly combines the recent past (the eighties and nineties of the retrospective) with today and its diverse communities (like the indigenous one which is the protagonist of Taiwanese film *Gaga*), expectations and life choices, languages and dialects, politics, religions, habits, inclinations, beliefs, myths and legends and, last but not least, its diverse gender identities. A selection that shows in real time how the cinemas of East and South East Asia have remerged from the gruelling period of the pandemic, not all in the same way and not all with the same results. A continent – the Far East - which even from a geopolitical point of view has an ever greater impact on our daily life and on our ideas about the world. And whose importance is felt here too.

MADE IN HONG KONG

In the post-Covid and post-National Security Law (established June 2020) world of the less "crowded" Hong Kong (a million people are said to have left forever), local Cantonese-language films are once again popular in the truest sense of the word. One example: *A Guilty of Conscience* by Jack NG (who will be a guest at FEFF 25 for the film's European premiere), released in January 2023, and earning the astronomical sum of 11 million euros, is the highest grossing Hong Kong film ever! And it's not a noir or an actioner, nor is it a Hollywood product. One in six people went to see it on the big screen (Hong Kong's population exceeds 6 million). What's happening in the former British colony is an authentic phenomenon: cinema attendance is through the roof, with even more people going to the cinema than before the pandemic. *A Guilty of Conscience* is a courtroom drama about a lawyer with a guilty conscience who ends up defending the underprivileged and the less fortunate. Cinema as bulwark of freedom?

FEFF 25 devotes ample space to HK cinema by bringing together, with the support of CreateHK, HKIFF and HKTEO, a selection of 6 brand new debut films grouped under the trademark *Making Waves - Navigators* of Hong Kong Cinema, to which are added Sunny Side of the Street, the latest film from Anthony Wong (Golden Mulberry for Lifetime Achievement in 2019) after Still Human, and the world premiere of Everyphone Everywhere by Amos Why, an acute, tragicomic reflection on the use and abuse of the mobile phone and on what can happen if you accidentally leave yours at home.

MISTER HIROKI AND JAPAN

Just like every year, Japan is represented by a large number of first-run films,a total of eight in competition as well as three special screenings and four titles in the retrospective. Among the most eagerly-awaited guests is eclectic and prolific director Hiroki Ryuichi, a dear friend of the FEFF, who will be presenting three of his films (the brand new Phases of the Moon, in competition, an exciting drama centred around the theme of reincarnation, You've Got a Friend, out of competition, a dramedy about the sadomasochistic practices of a quiet middle-aged office worker and, in the retrospective section, his first commercial feature film: 1994's 800 Two-Lap Runners, a variation on the teen movie). Grabbing the limelight in the Japanese section is the international premiere of *The Legend & Butterfly* by established director Otomo Keishi, here grappling with a historical drama. A war story that turns into a magnificent sixteenth-century epic and a delicate and passionate love story. As always, there's no shortage of brilliant and bizarre films from Japan such as Yudo, a heartfelt declaration of love for the senti, those public baths which, though once popular in cities, fell into disgrace in the 1970s. On the "auteur" side, mention should be made of *Egoist*, a beautiful and heartbreaking queer love story set in contemporary Tokyo, *She is Me, I* am Her, a film in four episodes set in the Covid era and directed by director Nakamura Mayu, and a real surprise: December - in a country like Japan which has long prided itself on its cultural homogeneity, this gripping courtroom drama is directed by an Indian (naturalised Japanese) director: Anshul Chauhan.

CHINA + TAIWAN + SOUTH EAST ASIA + MONGOLIA + SOUTH KOREA

As well as the Chinese remake of *Hachiko* arriving from *Beijing*, there are four titles from *Taiwan* (in addition to the aforementioned *Bad Education* and *Gaga*), including hilarious supernatural comedy *Marry My Dead Body* and *Day Off*, a touching portrait of a men's hairdresser. From *Thailand* comes the spectacular coming-of-age story *You&Me&Me*, directed by the twin Hongvivatana sisters, while from *Malaysia* there are two opposite titles (an auteur story about two brothers on the margins, *Abang Adik*, and *Cost Guard Malaysia*: *Ops Helang*, a breathtaking actioner). On the blockbuster and entertainment front, *Indonesia* brings back to Udine director Upi (*Sri Ashi*, a super-heroine story) and *Joko Anwar* (*Satan's Slave*: *Communion*, sequel to the blockbuster *Satan's Slave*) with their most recent movies. Then comes *Mongolia* with truly surprising film *The Sales Girl*, an irresistible comedy set among the shelves of a sex shop, and the *Philippines* with three films: horror movie *Deleter*, by Mikhail Red, dark fable *In My Mother's Skin*, Kenneth Dagatan's debut feature, and finally a beautiful comedy about scams and the dangers of the web: *Where Is the Lie?* by Quark Henares.

South Korea deserves a discussion of its own: one of the three most powerful cinematographic and audiovisual industries in the world, it **limped out of the pandemic** with audiences halved, cinemas transformed into gyms, dozens of films stuck awaiting a release date, and financial capital moving from cinema to TV. An unimaginable scenario, especially after *Parasite*'s Oscar win. In Seoul, fear reigns, and national distributors aren't investing in cinema or its promotion. But it's clearly a passing phase that only represents a temporary setback: Korean cinema will soon be back, more powerful than ever! The signs are evident in the **seven brand new films** that are part of the **FEFF 25** selection: from wonderfully disturbing

horror *The Other Child* and spectacular costume drama *The Night Owl*, about palace intrigues revealed by a blind acupuncturist, to *Phantom*, a spy thriller directed by Lee Hae-young which will soon be released in Italy under the *Lucky Red* imprint.

BAISHO CHIEKO: GOLDEN MULBERRY AWARD FOR LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT 2023

Her filmography's a mile long. Her discography numbers hit after hit. Miyazaki, a great admirer, secretly modelled Sophie Hatter, the main character of *Howl's Moving Castle*, on her. After **Takeshi Kitano**, 2022's winner, this year's **Far East Film Festival Golden Mulberry Award for Lifetime Achievement** will go to **Baisho Chieko!** The **famous Japanese actress and singer** will be bringing to **FEFF 25** her latest film, **Hayakawa Chie's** *Plan 75*, and two films that she has personally selected for the Udine audiences: the very first *Tora-san* film (1969) and *Where Spring Comes late* (1970).

Born in 1941, **Baisho Chieko** is extremely famous for having played, between 1969 and 1995, the role of Sakura in dozens of *Tora-san* films: beloved cult movies that were the result of a long-lasting artistic partnership with director Yamada Yoji. In 1980 she was awarded Best Actress at the Hōchi Film Awards for *Haruka naru yama no yobigoe* (*A Distant Cry of Spring*), also directed by Yamada Yoji, and is a very busy voice actress. *Plan 75*, presented at the 75th Cannes Film Festival (*Caméra d'Or Mention Spéciale*) and at the 40th Turin Film Festival, is the powerful debut film of Japanese director Hayakawa Chie and **will be released in Italian cinemas on the 11th of May with distribution by Tucker Film.** A project that, let's remember, the director discussed right here at the **industry sessions of Focus Asia** of the 2019 **FEFF** (as well as presenting the collective film *Ten Years Japan*).

WATANABE BROS IN COLOUR!

The other highly anticipated special guest at **FEFF 25** is **Watanabe Hirobumi**, the cult director from the farming town of Otawara! During the completely digital edition of 2020, the Festival dedicated a special focus section to the cinema of the **Watanabe Bros** (**Hirobumi** forms a superlative artistic duo with his composer younger brother **Yuji!**) Now **Hirobumi finally comes to Udine** to present to the public **two world premieres**: **Techno Brothers**, a Kraftwerk-esque road movie that pays homage to the **Blues Brothers** and **Aki Kaurismaki**, and the intimate and personal diary **Way Of Life** (which even mentions Udine!). The black and white aesthetic, the indie-punk style and the proverbial impassivity of the **Watanabe Bros**' cinema are this time put at the service of a stronger narrative. **And even more incredible, they're in colour!**

GREATEST HITS FROM '80s & '90s

Every story has a start date and the FEFF's is **the 10th of April, 1999**. Every story is born from a spark, and the spark that birthed the FEFF was the 1998 Udine Hong Kong Film. Every story and every spark, obviously, have their roots, and the **Far East Film Festival 25** has chosen to talk about its own... What happened in Asia between the end of the '80s and the dawn of the new millennium? What was the landscape of Korean cinema, today so popular with Western audiences, like back then? How did the fertile ground from which Japanese filmmakers sprouted take shape? In short: what was the FEFF like before the FEFF existed? This retrospective developed for the 25th anniversary, the largest ever seen at the Festival, will answer all these questions through a selection of **21 titles**. 21 artistic and geographical roots carefully selected from among the many milestones and masterpieces. **Those hidden masterpieces that have always shone in silence, like the B-sides of old 45s...** Some examples? In addition to Hiroki Ryuichi's aforementioned *800 Two Lap Runners* from 1994, Nonzee Nimibutr's seminal 1997 Thai gangster movie **Dang Bireley's and Young Gangsters**, Park Chan-wook's 1997 crime comedy and second feature **Trio**, Hsu

Hsiao-ming's *Dust of the Angels* from 1992 (produced by Hou Hsiao-hsien) and hilarious crime comedy *Teenage Fugitive* written by a Tsai Ming Liang who had just moved to Taipei from Malaysia.

PODCAST

From the economic crisis to Asia's great resurgence: here's the quarter of a century that did away with exoticism and consolidated the legend of a region grappling with tradition and modernity, rights and development... In the four anthological episodes of **brand new podcast Bambù**, produced by the **Far East Film Festival** and **Chora Media**, **Giulia Pompili** and **Francesco Radicioni** take us on a journey inside a generation that changed Asia through an interweaving of lives on screen and those in the real world, discussing fictional characters and those who have changed history. A generation grappling with the dilemmas of sex and the problem of low birth rates amid messages on social networks that build democratic movements to demand more rights. A look at the politics hiding behind a plate of noodles, a portion of fried chicken or the origin of a fermentation technique, or where religion starts to seep into government buildings, and places where sects and cults strike a difficult balance between the promise of salvation and a threat to security. **Bambù** is available on all platforms.

MASTERCLASS

New to **FEFF 25** this year are the **four masterclasses with four giants of Asian cinema**: **Johnnie To**, who returns to Udine to celebrate the anniversary of the festival (and the festival dedicates to him the focus section entitled **Johnnie Without a Gun**), the aforementioned **Hiroki Ryuichi**, the highly acclaimed **Jang Sun-woo** (remember his *Lies*, in competition at Venice?) and author, director and editor **Po Chih Leong** who, in the 1980s, represented the quintessence of genre cinema across the board, from comedy to drama and horror.

In the decade before Bong Joon Ho, Park Chan-wook and other directors initiated a transformation of Korean cinema, **Jang Sun-woo** stood as the most innovative, provocative, unpredictable and controversial filmmaker working in the industry. In this year's **FEFF** we present three of his films based on cutting-edge novels of the 1990s. **Road to the Racetrack** (1991), starring the great actress Kang Soo-yeon (who tragically passed away last year), satirizes the intellectual class while anticipating in some ways the work of Hong Sang-soo. **To You, From Me** (1994) and **Lies** (1999), both heavily censored in their local release, explore the interplay between sex, art and power with unusual directness and force.

FEFF ONLINE

With the support, as always, of MYmovies, the FEFF will once again this year offer a precious selection of online titles for the entire duration of the festival: 22 films that Asian distribution companies have made available for streaming. Subscription costs only €7.90 and will be available for purchase from the 6 th of April on the Mymovies ONE digital platform.

THE JURORS

If, as always, it's the public and only the public who will decide the three films that reach the podium of the Far East Film Festival 25, it will be down to two specialist juries to assign the White Mulberry for best first

film and the Mulberry for the best screenplay: these are respectively Ho Wi-ding, Sydney Sibilia and Fred Tsui and several jurors of the "Sergio Amidei" of Gorizia International Award for best screenplay, namely Massimo Gaudioso, Marco Risi, Marco Pettenello and Francesco Munzi. And let's take the opportunity to remember that the collaboration between the FEFF and the Amidei Prize will continue over time and marks the first shared step in GO! 2025, the project that is being developed in Friuli Venezia Giulia and in Slovenia for Nova Gorica/Gorizia, European Capital of Culture 2025.

FEFF 25: BAISHO CHIEKO WILL RECEIVE THE GOLDEN MULBERRY AWARD FOR LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT!

The famous Japanese actress will be presenting *Plan 75*, in which she stars, in Udine, together with two cult titles: the first *Tora-san* film and *Where Spring Comes Late*.

Plan 75, Mention Spéciale at Cannes, will be released in Italian cinemas on 11 May under the Tucker Film banner.

Her filmography is a mile long. Her discography numbers hit after hit. Miyazaki, a great admirer, secretly modelled Sophie Hatter, the main character of *Howl's Moving Castle*, on her... After **Takeshi Kitano**, 2022's winner, this year's **Far East Film Festival Golden Mulberry Award for Lifetime Achievement** will go to **Baisho Chieko**! The **famous Japanese actress and singer** will be bringing to **FEFF 25** her latest film, **Hayakawa Chie's** *Plan 75*, and two films that she has personally selected for the Udine audiences: the very first *Tora-san* film and *Where Spring Comes late*.

"When I learned that I'd been invited to the **Far East Film Festival in Udine** and that I would be receiving an award," says Baisho Chieko, "I said to myself, 'Really? For *Plan 75*?'. But instead... What a surprise! The **Golden Mulberry Award for Lifetime Achievement** celebrates all the work I've done since I entered the world of cinema! I'm really happy that my work as an actress is also appreciated abroad: films are a wonderful thing... I want to sincerely thank all the **FEFF** staff and, of course, I promise that I'll continue to act with passion and dedication..."

Born in 1941, **Baisho Chieko** is very famous for having played the role of Sakura in dozens of *Tora-san* films between 1969 and 1995: beloved cult movies that were the result of a long-lasting artistic partnership with director **Yamada Yoji**. In 1980 she was awarded Best Actress at the Hōchi Film Awards for *Haruka naru yama no yobigoe* (A *Distant Cry of Spring*), also directed by **Yamada Yoji**, and as a very busy voice actress she has often lent her talents to the world of animation, in films like *Gundam*, *Kimba The White Lion* and, as we've already mentioned, *Howl's Moving Castle*.

Plan 75, presented at the **75**th **Cannes Film Festival** (*Caméra d'Or Mention Spéciale*) and at the **40**th **Turin Film Festival**, is the powerful debut film of Japanese director **Hayakawa Chie** and **will be released in Italian cinemas on 11 May with distribution by Tucker Film.** A project that, as some of you may remember, the director discussed at the **industry sessions of Focus Asia** of the 2019 **FEFF** (as well as presenting the collective film *Ten Years Japan*).

Japan, tomorrow. A government program, Plan 75, aims to stem what has now become a national emergency: the ageing of the population. On the one hand are the public costs of welfare. On the other, the possibility for the elderly to resort to state euthanasia in exchange for logistical and financial support. Living or dying is no longer an ethical dilemma: it's a matter of bureaucracy. All you need to be is 75 years old...

Following Michi, an old woman who is just trying to get by, Hiromu, a programme salesman, and Maria, a Filipino nurse, **Hayakawa Chie** gracefully and naturally orchestrates a **rigorous social drama where dystopia**, **realism**, **moral inquiry and civil reflection converge**. **Plan 75** sees the eternal talent of **Baisho Chieko** sparkle in the role of Michi: symbol of an old Japan trying to resist the shocks of time and of modernity.

WHITE MULBERRY AWARD: THE BEST DEBUT FILM IN COMPETITION

THE WINNER WILL BE AWARDED BY AN INTERNATIONAL JURY OF PROFESSIONALS

The **White Mulberry**, the new award that was created for the Festival's 20th anniversary, will be given to the best debut film in competition at FEFF 25. An international jury was summoned to choose the winner:

HO Wi Ding

Wi Ding Ho, born and raised in Malaysia, attended the film school at NYU's Tisch School of the Arts, is currently based in Taipei.

His previous feature film Terrorizers world premiered at Toronto International Film Festival. The film was the Opening Film of 2021 Taipei Golden Horse International Film Festival, and garnered five nominations at the Golden Horse Awards. It was screened in various international festivals such as Bucheon International Fantastic Film Festival and last year Far Fast Film Festival of Udine.

His second feature film Cities of Last Things world premiered at Toronto International Film Festival and won its Platform Award; it also won many awards such as Grand Jury Prize at Beaune International Thriller Film Festival. It was the Opening Film of 2018 Singapore International Film Festival and travels close to twenty international film festivals.

His first feature film Pinoy Sunday (funded and supported by NHK, Japan) also world premiered at the Toronto International Film Festival. Domestically Pinoy Sunday made headlines in Taiwanese cinema in 2010 by featuring a film whose main language was not Mandarin and which starred two non-Taiwanese actors, and led to Wi Ding winning Best New Director Award from Golden Horse Award. It has since been hailed as a classic of modern Taiwanese cinema.

Wi Ding was first noticed at Critics Week of Cannes with his short film RESPIRE, where it won two awards and later Best Fantasy Short Film at SITGES Fantasy International Award. Back in 2005, the film depicted a distant future where people were required to wear masks by law because of the air born virus. It frightening predicts the Covid-19 pandemic fifteen years later.

Among the stars to take time to work with the Campus over the years have been Hong Kong legend **Johnnie To**, Oscar-winning Japanese director Ryusuke Hamaguchi, Oscar-nominated **Derek Tsang** – and superstars **Sammo Hung**, **Brigitte Lin** and **Moon So-ri**.

The 9th edition of the **FEFF Campus** is this year being supported by the Asian film-industry platform **Easternkicks.com** as well as by the likes of the **Taiwan News, Telum Media, Cineuropa** and **The New Straits Times.**

Focus Asia 2023 New ideas, new partners, new spaces

After the success of the 2022 edition, which was marked by the return to Udine of hundreds of industry professionals from all over the world, **Focus Asia** is back, with renewal as its catchword.

There are only a few days left before the announcement of the official selection of the *ALL GENRES PROJECT MARKET* - a section dedicated to projects in development suitable for co-production between Asia and Europe - and of *FAR EAST IN PROGRESS* - the first and only platform in Europe dedicated to Asian films seeking international distribution and previews at festivals – but there are already plenty of exciting new developments to reveal.

Now in its eighth edition, Focus Asia, the industry section of the Far East Film Festival, has managed to build up an extremely solid network of important international partners in order to launch an ambitious new programme that aims to unite the film industries of East and West more than ever.

For the first time, Focus Asia and *Ties That Bind*, the historic workshop that has been bringing together producers from Asia and Europe in Udine for over 14 years, is launching a partnership with the **Marché du Film-Festival de Cannes** in order to construct a programme based around two events: the first at the end of April as part of Focus Asia and the second in Cannes as part of the new *Spotlight Asia* project. The idea is to offer around twenty producers who have been selected and supported by the **British Film Institute**, **Canada Media Fund**, **Ciclic - Centre-Val de Loire**, **Luxembourg Film Fund**, **Norwegian Film Institute**, **Netherlands Film Fund** and **Polish Film Institute** a bespoke programme designed to highlight the real opportunities offered by the two continents and thus stimulate new forms of collaboration.

The team from **Europa Distribution**, the main European network of independent distributors, will also be back in Udine, this time accompanied by 20 distributors from over 16 European countries who will be taking part in the brand new *Distribution Lab*. The workshop will include case studies, group work and screenings and will be entirely dedicated to discovering and sharing best practices and innovative strategies for promoting the distribution of Asian cinema in Europe and vice versa.

But the reach of the Focus Asia 2023 partner network isn't confined to the West: numerous partnerships have been confirmed and initiated this year with the main funding and promotional entities in the Philippines, Japan, Indonesia, Singapore and Taiwan.

Once again this year **TAICCA** - **Taiwan Creative Content Agency** confirms its central role in planning all the industry activities of the Far East Film Festival, and after becoming the main Asian partner of Ties That Bind and having hosted the premiere session of the workshop in Taipei last November, introduces the *TAICCA/Focus Asia Co-production Award*, a prize worth €10,000 which will be awarded to the project with the greatest potential for co-production between Europe and Asia.

And in addition to the launch of this extremely important new award, thanks to its collaboration with FDCP - Film Development Council of the Philippines, VIPO - Visual Industry Promotion Organization, Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia, IMDA - Infocomm Media Development Authority and TAICCA - Taiwan Creative Content Agency, and the support of ICE - Agenzia per la promozione all'estero e l'internazionalizzazione delle imprese italiane, the Focus Asia programme's Project Market and the Far East in Progress section will in fact be able to count on the direct support of the directors and producers of the projects and works in progress at this edition, with the aim of guaranteeing the physical presence of the greatest number of selected teams.

And finally, this large-scale renewal in terms of content and collaboration also extends to the physical locations of the event itself. In fact, for the first time, all the activities dedicated to the industry public of Focus Asia, i.e. the circa 200 professionals from the international film industry who will meet in Udine from the 26th to the 28th of April, will be welcomed at the *Torre S. Maria* and the *Foresteria* of **Confindustria Udine**, a point of reference for local industry.

TIES THAT BIND IN UDINE!

The second workshopof the 14th edition of**TIES THAT BIND** will take place between April 24 – 28, 2023, in Udine,in **parallel to FOCUS ASIA**, the Industry section of the Udine Far East Film Festival.

The rich programme of the plenary sessions for the TTB workshop is prepared in **collaboration with FOCUS ASIA**. It will feature**three co-production case studies**, moderated by TTB Head of Studies **Christophe Bruncher**:

- TTB graduatesBianca Balbuena and Bradley Liew (Epicmedia Productions, PH), Junxiang Huang (Zhao Wei Films, SG) and Stefano Centini (Volos Films, TW) produced IN MY MOTHER'S SKIN by Kenneth Dagatan, which premiered in Midnight Section at Sundance 2023asthe only non-English-language film and was sold to Amazon.
- TTB graduates Jeremy Chua (Potocol, SG) and Bostjan Virc (Studio Virc, SI) will elaborate on producing debut featureLAST SHADOW AT FIRST LIGHTby Nicole Midori Woodford. The film is coproduced by Shozo Ichiyama's Fourier Films (JP), in association with Purple Tree Content, 108 Media, cogitoworks, Nocturne Films, Hello Group, Prism Pictures, White Light Bangkok, VS Service, and True Colour Media.
- **Emilie Georges** (Paradise City, UK& Memento International, FR) will share her experiences on 4-country-co-production (FR-UK-GR-SG) **DRIFT** by Anthony Chen, shown in the **Premieres Section at Sundance 2023**. Sales are handled by **Memento International**.

Furthermore, the TTB participants will have the opportunity to receive **feedback on the distribution potential** of their projects fromtop-notch Asian and European distributors. Sales agent **Nicolas Brigaud-Robert** (Playtime, FR) will elaborate on the current trends of the **international market**. Additional sessions will provide insight intoworking with private equityinvestors.

Individual meetings with TTB expertswill be organised on topics such as Asian films and festivals with Roger Garcia (HK) and sales opportunities with Yasmine Talli (mk2 films, FR). TTB's script consultant Clare Downs (UK) will focus on developing their scripts and TTB's pitching consultant Sibylle Kurz (DE) will work on their presentation and communication skills.

The participants willalso have **individual meetings with key industry professionals at Focus Asia**, to foster new collaborations between European and Asian professionals.

FEFF 25 GOES GREEN!

The FEFF joins the AFIC network of Green Festivals and puts "green actions" in place.

The FEFF continues its commitment to its "green" mission by joining the AFIC Green Festival network and implementing "green actions" in the context of:

- sustainable mobility
- sustainable energy consumption (partly thanks to energy-saving systems and equipment)
- printing of materials (reduction of printed materials, use of certified paper)
- displays/stands etc. (reuse and adaptation of materials from past editions, recycled and certified materials)
- waste management (collaboration with Net, public and staff awareness, waste reduction)
- production of giveaway items (useful, long-lasting and sustainable, made with certified materials, ethical fashion)
- food sustainability (km0, low CO2 impact menu), incentives for the use of public water
- environmental culture and social sustainability (inclusive and trans-generational staff, local suppliers, accessibility)
- management of guests (with verification of accommodation facility characteristics)
- training and communication (workshops and meetings for schools on sustainability issues, events aimed at the public)
- assessment of the impact of the festival
- no greenwashing

To look at just one of these aspects - sustainable mobility - since the organisation of and participation in the event make it impossible to completely eliminate air travel, most of the films now use "digital delivery," while on a local scale low-emission vehicles are preferred, the use of public transport and bike sharing are promoted, the services that the city offers in terms of transport, electric car charging, bike sharing are highlighted, and guests are sensitised to walking and using public transport for their movements. Parallel events are organised in all the pedestrian areas of the city.

On the morning of the 26th of April, educational project *Together We Go Green* will also be presented inside the Teatro Nuovo Giovanni da Udine Theatre. The presentation will be carried out by students of the Uccellis International Chinese Scientific High School who are engaged in a cross-cultural journey to discover good practices and to raise awareness of a more sustainable lifestyle, carried out in collaboration with the Regional Laboratory of Environmental Education of ARPA FVG. The Video Documentation Laboratory of the course (in which students from the Tsinghua International School Daoxiang Lake in Beijing will participate remotely) is being managed by the Centre for Visual Arts of the Mario Quargnolo Media Library of the Visionario, with funding from the National Cinema Plan for Schools - CIPS for the academic year 2022-2023.
