CLOSURE REPORT

UDINE FAR EAST FILM FESTIVAL

The Far East Film Festival (FEFF) is the largest festival for popular Asian cinema in Europe. It takes place every year in Udine, Italy, and is organized by a non-profit cultural organization, Centro Espressioni Cinematografiche (C.E.C.). The 25th edition of the Far East Film Festival is held at the Opera Theatre "Giovanni da Udine" with 1,200 seats (Via Trento, 4) and, at the art-house cinema "Visionario" (via Asquini 33). At the same time, MYmovies.it, the largest Italian website dedicated to quality cinema, welcomed back the online festival, providing a large range of films to its audience.

Besides film showings, the festival organizes several programs for film professionals and aspiring journalists, as well as collateral events around the city dedicated to Asian culture, such as cooking shows, dance performances, conferences, etc.

Every year FEFF screens more than 70 films from far East and South-East Asian countries, mainly as World, International or European premieres.

Filmmakers who have attended the previous editions include talents such as Jackie Chen, Johnnie To, Feng Xiaogang, Sammo Hung, Takashi Miike, Hideo Nakata, Joe Hisaishi, Albert Lee, Brigitte Ching Hsia Lin and many more.

THE AWARD

The audience of Udine awarded the first prize, *Golden Mulberry Award*, as well as the *Black Mulberry Award* (audience award amongst the Black Dragon badge holders) to the Malaysian director Jin Ong's debut film *Abang Adik*. In second place, *Silver Mulberry Award*, the Korean drama *Rebound*, while the third prize, *Crystal Mulberry Award*, went to the Japanese drama-comedy *Yudo*.

The jurors for the best director debut film (Fred Tsui, the CEO of Moebius Entertainment Ltd., Hong Kong and the directors Ho Wi Ding, Taiwan, and Sydney Sibilia, Italy) confirmed the general enthusiasm for *Abang Adik*, awarding it the *White Mulberry Award*. The White Mulberry Juror also awarded as Special Mention *Lost Love* of director Ka Sing-fung.

Fu Tien-yu's *Day Off* received the Mulberry Award for Best Screenplay, selected by Francesco Munzi, Marco Pettenello, Marco Risi and Massimo Gaudioso, jurors of Gorizia's "Sergio Amidei" Prize.

Then MYmovies viewers chose Mongolian's *The Sales Girl* by Janchivdorj Sengedorj, as winner of the *Purple Mulberry Award*.

Another notable award, the *Golden Mulberry for Lifetime Achievement*, was presented to the Japanese actress Baisho Chieko, starring in Chie Hayakawa's *Plan 75*.

FAR EAST FILM FESTIVAL CAMPUS

The Far East Film Festival Campus is a program started in 2015 in order to providing a unique opportunity for young journalists to go "behind the scenes" at a film festival, while learning from the expertise provided by a line-up of media and film-industry veterans. In 2023 the FEFF Campus, under the leadership of the project coordinator Mathew Scott, hits its 9th edition. 10 aspiring journalists from Asia and Europe were hosted at FEFF to promote the exchange between East and West, reaching a total of 90 youth participants since 2015.

Among other things, this may be a driving force for the continued growth of FEFF as the leading European platform for Asian cinema's visibility and promotion.

FOCUS ASIA

After a very successful 2022 edition, the Far East Film Festival launched FOCUS ASIA 2023, one of the leading markets exclusively dedicated to film professionals from Asia and Europe keen to strength their industry and artistic connections.

Launched in 2016 the three-day industry event is now a unique platform where producers, sales agents, film distribution companies, television broadcasters, VOD platforms and Internet Player Companies from Asia and Europe have the opportunity to exchange views and further develop their relations.

Focus Asia was held from 26 to 28 April in Udine. With over 200 participants from 35 territories, 11 projects in development, 8 works in progress and 3 days of panels & case studies and over 200 one to one meetings, it confirmed its unique role in fostering artistic and production links between Asia and Europe.

Within this special edition, marked by a large series of new partnerships and reinvented initiatives, the first ever TAICCA/Focus Asia Co-Production Award, cash prize worth €10,000 awarded to the project with the greatest potential for co-production between Europe and Asia, went to the Singapore project *Amoeba*. The launch of this new award is part of a revamped international strategy based on a close long-lasting collaboration with a large network of Asian and European partners.

TIES THAT BIND

Launched in 2009, this is an innovative workshop dedicated to co-productions between Asia and Europe, the only of its kind in the world.

For its 14th edition, this leading workshop programme connecting professionals from Asia and Europe, selected 26 participants including directors coming from 14 countries to work on their feature film projects in development, under the guidance of top-level experts from both continents. TTB takes place over a year through 2 workshops offering comprehensive knowledge of the European and Asian film industries and markets. The participants benefit from high-level development under the guidance of top-notch experts from both continents and have the opportunity to meet with key decision makers during the online edition of ATF - Asia TV Forum & Market (Singapore), and FOCUS ASIA, the Industry Section of the Udine Far East Film Festival (Italy).

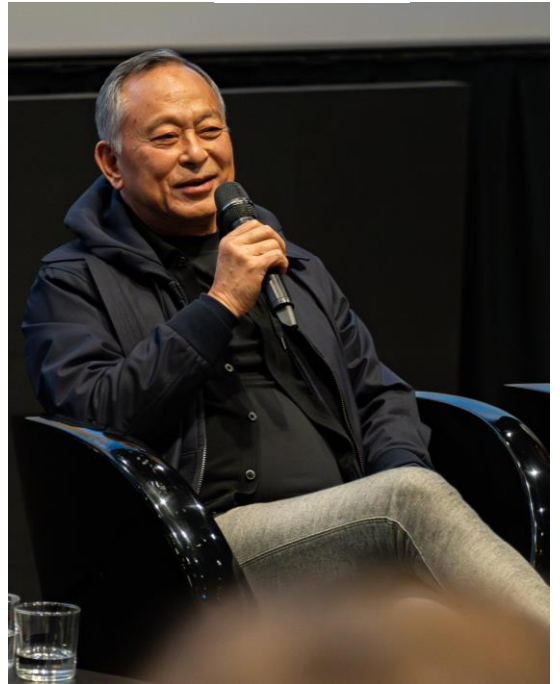
